In Tasmania's mining region:

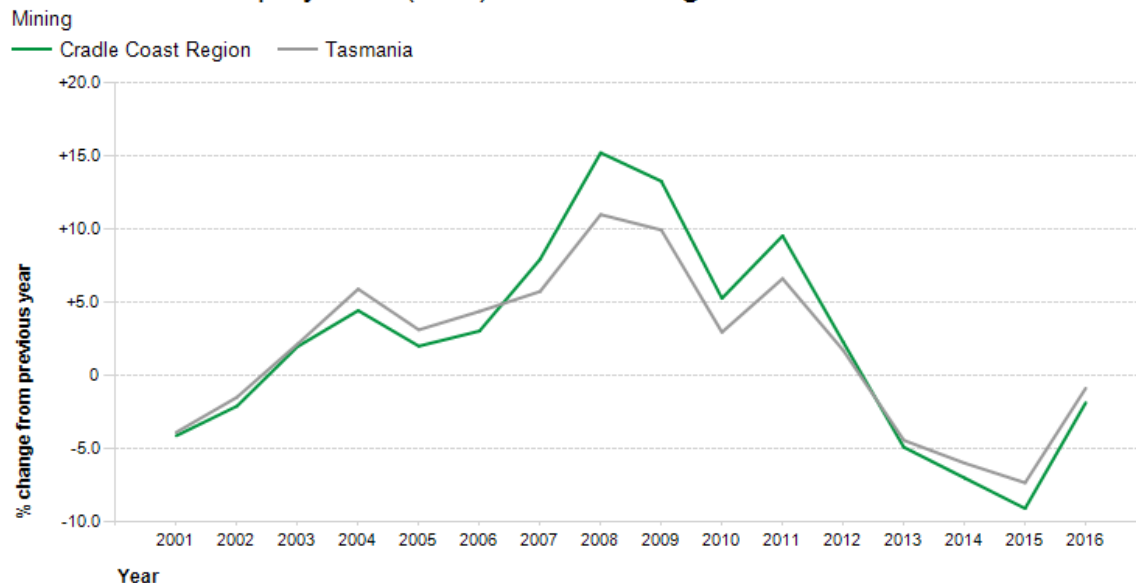
- value of the "test bed"

- Don't promise a false future

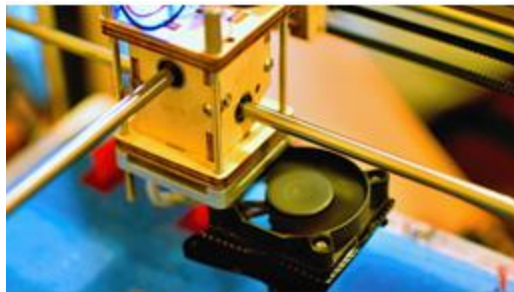
Time series - Employment (total) annual change
